EUCIM-TE considers new qualification needs for teachers affected by policy shifts from a "compartmentalised" concept of second language teaching to immigrant pupils to an "inclusive education" in which second language education is seen as an integral part of a generalised and common curriculum process, i.e. mainstreamed.


Main aim of the project


The steps of the project's work



The main outputs of the project


- 1. a European Core Curriculum for Inclusive Academic Language Teaching and Manual
- 2. the National Adaptations into 8 European contexts, aiming at the implementation of the Curriculum into pre- and in-service teacher training.
